pressing not pushing dynamic equilibrium yielding not pulling

[SALTMARSH] causing disturbance these exceptional wetlands harboring secrets

beyond Interest

tide rises and falls renewing relationships seeking difference

[SALTMARSH] oxygen - carbon an atmosphere of breathing carbon - oxygen

not so much a vacuum more a way of life making space for questions
