# All research is about finding something out

- 1. What do I want to find out?
- 2. Why is your subject important?
- 3. How will I find out, and why is this the best way?
- 4. What resources do I need?
- 5. How will I communicate my findings and to whom?
- 6. Do stages 2, 3, and 4 address the Research Questions?

1. What do I want to find out?

This question will generate both your aims and research questions.

2. Why is your subject important?

This question provides the **context** for your Research Questions and Literature Review.

3. How will I find out, and why is this the best way? This question provides the methods to address Research Questions. Different methods add up to a methodology.

4. What resources do I need? This question provides your management structure: collaborators, finances, equipment and schedule/timeline/GANNT

5. How will I communicate my findings and to whom? This question addresses issues of dissemination and impacts.

6. Do stages 2, 3, and 4 address the Research Questions and nothing else? They should each correspond to each other.
